

NCAA Eligibility Standards

Student Athletes

Students interested in participating in a sport at a Division I or Division II college/university must pursue a high school course of study which fulfills the **Initial-Eligibility Requirements** imposed by the NCAA. A prospective student-athlete must complete the specific core courses outlined by the NCAA (see below chart) to meet the initial-eligibility standards.
